Parent and Student Learning Survey 2025/2026

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. The surveys contain standard questions for the province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

Black History Month

Every February, people in Canada are invited to participate in Black History Month festivities and events that honour the legacy of Black Canadians and their communities. The 2026 theme for Black History Month is: **30 Years of Black History Month: Honouring Black Brilliance Across Generations — From Nation Builders to Tomorrow’s Visionaries.**

February 15, 2026 – Maha Shivaratri (Hindu)

Warm wishes to members of the Hindu community observing Maha Shivaratri, the “Great Night of Lord Shiva.” — honouring the triumph of light over darkness and the power of spiritual renewal. May this observance bring peace, strength, and spiritual renewal. Translation note: Maha Shivaratri (महाशिवरात्रि) means “Great Night of Shiva.” Pronounced: MAH-ha SHIH-vah-rah-tree.

February 17, 2026 – Lunar New Year (Chinese, Taiwanese, Korean, Vietnamese, and several Southeast Asian communities)

Happy Lunar New Year to all who celebrate! As you welcome the Year of the Horse, may this time of renewal bring joy, connection, and hope to you and your families. Translation note: Known as Chūn Jié (春节) in Mandarin, Seollal (설날) in Korean, and Tết Nguyên Đán in Vietnamese. Pronounced: Choon-jyeh, Suhl-lahl, Tet Nguyen Dan.

February 17 (or February 18- ~March 18), 2026 – Beginning of Ramadhan (Islamic)

We extend our best wishes to the Muslim students, staff, and families as the holy month of Ramadhan begins. May this holy month of reflection, fasting, giving to charity and community continue to foster compassion, gratitude, and spiritual renewal for you and your loved ones. Translation note: Ramadhan (Arabic: رَمَضَانَ, often spelled Ramadan) meaning “heat”, as the month originally was supposed to fall on the hottest months. Pronounced: RAH-mah-dhan or RAH-mah-zan.

February 18, 2026 – Ash Wednesday (Christian)

To the Christian students, staff, and families preparing for the Lenten season: we send warm greetings on Ash Wednesday, as this day marks a time of reflection, renewal, and preparation. May you find meaning in the season ahead as you journey toward Easter.
