STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY 2022/2023 survey closes on the 29th

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2023** the Student Learning Survey were administered to students in grades 4 and 7. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access at home, work, or school.
- 2. Go to www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm
- 3. Under the section *Direct Access no logon number required* select:
- District: 38 Richmond
- School: Walter Lee Elementary
- Language: the language of your choice
- 4. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.

- 5. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- 6. Once complete, your school will have the results immediately.

The e-survey site will be open until April 29th.

PARENT INPUT - CLASS PLACEMENTS FOR 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

Each year at this time, we begin to make school organization plans for September based upon the number of students we know are returning and new registrations. Before school ends in June, your child's current classroom teacher, resource staff, educational assistants and administration will work together to place students for the upcoming school year. Despite these challenging times, this process will still take place but with alternative procedures for staff coming together. These plans are tentative until the first week in September when final student numbers are known. In the first few days of September, all staff meet to confirm teaching assignments and review student placements.

In the organizational meetings, many factors are considered when placing students. Considerations include: learning styles and strengths, social / personal characteristics, students with special needs, ELL Levels, contractual obligations

As you can see, this is a complicated process, and this list is by no means exclusive, as there are many factors unique to a situation that must and will be taken into account.

If you would like the opportunity to provide the school with information about your child's placement for next year, you are welcome to send a letter to Mr. Chan at alchan@sd38.bc.ca by Monday, June 2nd. We will not accept any letters that come in after June 2nd. The information you provide should not include a request for a specific teacher, but rather some important personal or educational information that will assist us in our decision. Please be aware that the final decision regarding placement needs to be a school-based decision.

- All international students with valid BC Study Permits will be charged tuition fees and may take one or more courses.

- Students may enroll in ONE or MORE fee paying summer camps.
- Students who have completed Kindergarten can register for Grade 1 Summer Courses.
- Students who have completed Grade 7 can register for Grade 8 summer courses (except Skill Building 8 and 9)
