


Reminder of school parking and drop-off guidelines


To ensure the safety of students please be aware of the guidelines and directions for our school parking lot.

LET'S KEEP OUR PARKING LOT SAFE FOR LEE STUDENTS & FAMILIES! Our school parking lot gets extre nely busy before and after school. For everyone's safety

PLEASE FOLLOW these Parking Lot Safety reminders for safer traffic flow during these busy times.

PARKING LOT SAFETY REMINDERS

- ONLY PARK IN PARKING STALLS. Keep moving in the driving lane to avoid traffic jar
- ONLY PARK IN PARKING STALLS. Keep moving in the driving lane to avoid traffic jams.
 NO PARKING IN THE DROP OFF LANE or STAFF PARKING AREA. Only stop in the Drop Off Lane long enough for your child to get out/get into car less than 1 minute.
 If you need to park and leave your car, PARK ON NEARBY STREETS. There is parking all around the school. Please see neighbourhood map.
 PLEASE SLOW DOWN and watch out for our students and families.
 KEEP THE CROSSWALKS CLEAR to ensure our students and families can cross safely.

<u>German Heritage Month</u> (<u>link</u>): A time to recognize the contributions German Canadians have had and how their heritage has shaped Canada's current social and economic fabric.

<u>Canadian Islamic History Month</u> (link): A time when all Canadians can learn more about the culture, contributions, and achievements of the Muslim community. **Go <u>here</u>** (link) **to access IHM poster featuring 10 Muslim Olympians** who competed at the 2024 Paris Olympics. The poster highlights their achievements and resilience.

Community Inclusion Month (link): This month celebrates the valuable contributions that people with developmental disabilities make and recognizes the importance of communities where everyone is included.

Latin American Heritage Month (link): A time to showcase the richness and vitality of Latin American cultures and heritage while reflecting on the contributions the Latin American community have made to Canadian culture.

Women's History Month (link): In 1992, the Government of an annual month long

Canada designated October as Women's History Month, marking the beginning of an annual month-long celebration of the outstanding achievements of women throughout Canada's history.

Jewish New Year: Rosh Hashana (link). A significant two-day celebration of the Jewish New Year that begins on the evening of October 2, ends at nightfall on October 4, and Kol Nidrei (link), a prayer evening which ushers in the Jewish holiday, Yom Kippur (link) on October 11/12.

In addition, **our students, families and staff, observing Hinduism**, will be celebrating **Dussehra** (link). An event celebrated on the 10th day of the month of Ashvina (September-October), the seventh month of the Hindu calendar, with the appearance of the full moon, an event called the "bright fortnight" (*shukla paksha*).
