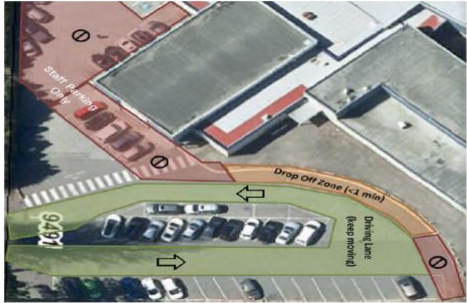

Our school parking lot gets extremely busy before and after school. For everyone's safety, **PLEASE FOLLOW** these Parking Lot Safety reminders for safer traffic flow during these busy times.

- **ONLY PARK IN PARKING STALLS.** Keep moving in the driving lane to avoid traffic jams.
- **NO PARKING IN THE DROP OFF LANE or STAFF PARKING AREA.** Only stop in the Drop Off Lane long enough for your child to get out/get into car - less than 1 minute.
- If you need to park and leave your car, **PARK ON NEARBY STREETS.** There is parking all around the school. Please see neighbourhood map.
- **PLEASE SLOW DOWN** and watch out for our students and families.
- **KEEP THE CROSSWALKS CLEAR** to ensure our students and families can cross safely.
